Programs Offered at FWCL

Intensive Instruction Programs: Trained instructors work with the student using evidence based programs best suited for the student based on their academic pre-assessment. Instruction is tailored to each student and builds a strong foundation of fundamental skills.

Skills Taught: Reading, Phonemic Awareness, Spelling, Reading and Listening Comprehension, Reading and Math Fluency, Mathematical Reasoning and Computation, Visual/Spatial Strategies, and Critical Thinking

Best for students with low assessment scores, students with diagnosed or undiagnosed learning and neurological disabilities, or students that are behind for their grade level. We work with students that struggle with dyslexia, dyscalculia, ADHD, etc.

Tutoring: Instructors work with students in specific areas on a non-intensive basis to assist in the completion of homework and comprehension of school subjects.

Skills Taught: Comprehension and application of skills related to the subject.

Best for students who do not require intensive instruction in a subject, but still need extra support. This is also good for students who struggle with specific concepts or theories, or need help implementing their new skills following intensive instruction.

Academic Independence Management (AIM) Program: Instructors work with your child to support, coach, and facilitate the use of strategies and techniques along with their Individual Performance Plan to help them focus on organization, grade tracking and communication with teachers.

Skills Taught: Study skills, note and test taking skills, homework completion, time management, and accountability.

Best for students who have completed intensive instruction and now need help implementing their new skills, students that struggle with organization and focus.

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What is the process to start services?

- ◇ An academic assessment is done to identify strengths and weaknesses.
- ◇ The Director of Instruction will go over the results of the assessment with the parents/guardians and discuss our recommendation for services. Our staff will be able to answer any questions about the program and how remediation will be conducted.
- ◇ The student is scheduled to start sessions with our trained staff.
- ◇ After sessions are complete, the center will administer a post-assessment to determine how the student has improved and make recommendations for further services if necessary.

Pre to post-assessment gains made by students in the 2022-2023 school year

- ◇ Overall Comprehension test scores increased by 124%
- ◇ Overall Reading test scores increased by 99%
- ◇ Overall Math test scores increased by 112%
- ◇ Students attended an average of 91.67 hours of instruction

Why are the programs at FWCL so effective?

FWCL teaches foundational skills that can be applied to any topic and create lifelong learning.

Socratic Teaching

is a way of asking strategic questions that guide the student through the problem solving process and promotes critical thinking

Verbal Mediation

encourages an internal dialog that facilitates learning and problem solving.

Self-Coaching

teaches students how to guide their own growth and development

Diagnostic Teaching

allows our instructors to tailor instruction to the child based on their learning style, objectives and abilities

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
